
I invite you to open wide your heart, and to share generously your time, talent, and treasure, in gratitude for all the love and mercy that God has shown to you.

Strengthening families by supporting locally based programs

ince 1997, the Vicariate Outreach Program has distributed more than \$15 million, thanks to the extraordinary generosity of Appeal donors. Last year, for the second consecutive year, more than \$1 million was allocated to parish-identified charities in Hartford, New Haven and Litchfield counties. This funding provided support to families and individuals for life's basic necessities: a warm meal, a bag of groceries, a place to sleep, or a place to turn for guidance and support

mmaCare, Food Share, Mercy Housing and Shelter Corporation, South Park Inn - Homeless Shelter, Little Sisters of the Poor, and Police Activity League of Hartford are just a few of the Hartford area charities that put your Appeal gift to great use. In Hartford the Police Activity League (PAL) provides the youth of Hartford with positive guidance during their childhood years through after school and summer programs. A strong support system, such as PAL, has a direct relationship with lowering the number of young people with disciplinary problems in school or on the street, and has a powerful impact on a child's future. The PAL program instills a sense of pride and self-worth in these children as they strive to become active participants in their community.

Seemingly alone, they often look to identify with what reminds them of home, which includes attending Mass. Campus Ministry provides students the opportunity to grow, not only in their faith and education, but socially in a Catholic setting. The Rev. Michael Ruminski former Chaplain of Campus Ministry at the University of Hartford said recently, "Our young people are the future of the church, and the transition point from being at home to being a young adult away from home and looking towards a career, is the key time in which we find our faith, we find our identity as a member of the body of Christ, it's very easy to lose yourself during that period of time."

ften it is in an academic setting that a young man will recognize the call to the priesthood. Campus Ministries can provide this opportunity to explore the faith, and strengthen one's relationship with God, yet ask the questions that permit him to discern God's plan for his life. Catholic Campus Ministry is the silent partner that helps bridge the gap between the youth of today and the adults of the future.
